

FALL GREENING & STUDENT ROUNDUP

The USGBC Central Plains Chapter – Wichita Branch hosted the Second Annual Roundup of Students for a GREEN Experience with Professionals at an Official 2012 USGBC Green Apple Day Service Project. The day kicked off with a tour of the Wichita Transit Van Maintenance Facility, the first LEED Certified building built for the City of Wichita, KS. The facility achieved Silver Certification utilizing an enhance envelope, natural

daylight, high efficiency lighting and mechanical equipment, rainwater reclamation and reuse, and low-flow plumbing fixtures. Silver Certification was achieved under LEED v2009.

The afternoon focus was on FRESH AIR BABY CAMP, which is one of two sustainability projects ASHRAE – Wichita Chapter will be involved with this year. The building (placed on the National Register of Historic Places in 2007) is currently undergoing demolition. We had three members

Research and Promotion

Out with the old and in with the new. Once again our theme this year is "strength in numbers", not "dollars per member." We're tough to beat in that regard. A moderate contribution by m any seems much less surmountable than some big numbers put up by a few.

Our 2011-2012 investment of \$16,462, as noted at the recent Chapters
Regional Conference (CRC) in Billings, earned us yet another reward for exceeding our Goal of \$15,000 in
Research Promotion. As stated before, we do remarkably well, year in and year out, for a Chapter of our size, especially in the following categories:

President's Award of Excellence (PAOE)

- We finished at 4,572 in Region IX, well ahead of second place Utah at 3,208.
- We were 6th, overall in Society. (Last year we were 35th.)

Dollars per Assigned Member

- Society Goal is \$50 / Member.
- We finished at \$146 / Member.
- We were 10th, overall, in Society. (Last year we were 10th at \$153.)
- We were 2.2 times the Region
 IX average of \$67., and nearly
 3.2 times the Society average of \$47.
- 49% of our Assigned Members contribute, as compared with 13% for Society, overall.
